THE GERALD PERMAN FUND FOR EMERGING ARTISTS In 2013, we established the Gerald Perman Fund for Emerging Artists in honor of our esteem founder, Dr. Gerald Perman (1923-2015). We launched our 25th Anniversary season in 2015 with our first ever commissioned song cycle, <i>Iconic Legacies: First Ladies at the Smithsonian</i> , and a long-range commitment to commissioning new works for solo voice. Introduced to our audience by mezzo-soprano Susan Graham in collaboration with its composer, Iconic Legacies returned to our series this year as the final work on a recital by mezzo-soprano Jamie Barton, again accompanied by the composer, following the duo having committed it to disc on a Grammy-nominated album for PentaTone Classics. The second of our commissions, Gregory Spears' <i>Walden</i> , to text by David Thoreau, will also be released on a recording slated for later this calendar year on the Bridge Classics label and performed by its creators, baritone Brian Mulligan and pianist Timothy Long. We have commissioned other works from composers as diverse as Caroline Shaw, Tyshawn Sorey and Michael Ippolito and, with your help, will continue to broaden a diversified library of songs for a whole new generation of artists and audiences.
